SPAIN CROWNED CHAMPIONS AT THE FIP XV EUROPEAN POLO CHAMPIONSHIP IN POLAND

The FIP XV European Polo Championship came to a close with a true celebration of the sport at Sowiniec Polo Club in Poznań, Poland. Over nearly two weeks, players, horses, and fans enjoyed top-class polo in an environment that combined excellent fields, strong organization, and a festive atmosphere that drew large crowds. The final was the highlight of this success, as Spain claimed the title with a 7.5-4 victory over Switzerland.

The deciding match featured Spain with Juan Manuel Marulanda, Sebastián Luque, Juan Torroba, and Alfonso Figar, against Switzerland's Fabio Meier, Luca Meier, Patricio Gaynor Jr., and Tomás Ruiz Guiñazu. Switzerland led the opening chukker 2–1.5 and went into halftime ahead 3–2.5, but Spain fought back strongly. Four unanswered goals in the last chukker sealed the win for the Spanish side. In the semifinals, Spain had edged Poland 5–4.5, while Switzerland defeated Italy 9–5 to reach the final. ▶









The third-place playoff saw Poland secure bronze on home soil, defeating Italy 6.5–4. In the classification matches, the Netherlands took fifth place with a 7–5 win over Germany, while Hungary narrowly overcame France 6–4.5 to finish seventh.

VOICES FROM THE PLAYERS AND HOSTS Juan Torroba – Spain



VOICES FROM THE PLAYERS AND HOSTS

Sebastián Luque - Spain

Participating in this tournament was an incredible and deeply emotional experience. The European Championship has tremendous prestige. Even though it is not a high-goal tournament, representing your nation gives it a completely different dimension. Every team arrived extremely well prepared, with coaches, fitness trainers, and high-quality horses. The level of competitiveness was outstanding, both technically and physically, and it is hard to imagine another tournament at this handicap where the intensity and quality of play are so high.

Just being part of it was already a privilege, but to come away as European champions was indescribable. We were four amateur friends (probably the only team without professionals), and I don't think we were ever considered the favorites. But we had a very solid run, full of grit, teamwork, and commitment in every game. We grew stronger with each match, believed in ourselves, and enjoyed the journey.

The final was especially memorable. We faced a very strong Swiss team, probably the favorite of the tournament,

who had already beaten us in the group stage. We started behind and trailed for almost the entire match, but we managed to stay calm and turn it around in the last chukker. That moment, when we came from behind to win the title, was simply unforgettable. Personally, it has been the most moving championship of my polo career—one of those stories I will always keep and one day tell my grandchildren: how four friends entered the Spanish Championship, won it, were chosen to represent Spain at the European Championship... and won that too!

Beyond the competition itself, the tournament atmosphere was impeccable. From day one, there was respect, camaraderie, and sportsmanship among all teams. Every game was enjoyable, and the spirit off the field was just as good.

Sowiniec was a spectacular stage. The fields were outstanding. Despite heavy rain in the first days, the condition of the ground was exceptional; it absorbed water better than almost any field I've seen. Even with up to four matches a day, the surface held firm, allowing for fast polo, agile turns, and a ball that rolled consistently and predictably, which made for a very high level of play.

And beyond the matches, the entire Sowiniec team ensured we had an unforgettable experience, both on and off the field. The organization took care of every detail: from field maintenance to the "after polo" and the social environment. A very special thank you to the whole team at Sowiniec for making it possible. It was truly a tournament to remember.

Everything started with the idea of four friends coming together to play the qualifier for this tournament in Spain, where we won and earned the opportunity to represent our country at the European Championship. It was truly an incredible experience, unlike anything I had ever lived before, not only because of the people I met but also because of traveling to a place I never imagined I would get to know.

We were fortunate to have Benjamin Araya as our coach. He was not only a great polo player but also a wonderful person from whom I was able to learn so much. When we arrived at Sowiniec Polo Club, we were absolutely impressed by the facilities. The fields were world-class—maintained to perfection, unlike any I had seen before. The club was exceptionally well-managed, with multiple arenas, a first-class exercise track, and immaculate stables. It is worth congratulating the Switalski family and Facundo for building and maintaining such a club, where every detail was impeccable, and where one



feels completely at home. They were incredible hosts, and I honestly believe very few clubs worldwide are on this level.

The level of play in the championship was very high. It was a competitive 8-goal tournament, with organizations and countries well-prepared in terms of horses and players. I see it as a prestigious event where every participant enters with the highest

aspiration of winning. For me, winning this tournament has been the most important achievement of my polo career so far, made even more special by sharing it with three great friends.

Mateusz, hosting the XV FIP European Polo Championship at Sowiniec Polo Club, was a milestone for Polish polo. What did it mean for you personally and for the club to welcome such a prestigious event?

Hosting the FIP European Polo Championship was both a tremendous challenge and a great honor. Personally, it was a dream come true to see Sowiniec Polo Club become the stage for one of the most important tournaments in Europe. On the sporting side, Poland reached the semifinals and narrowly lost by half a goal to the eventual champions, Spain, before securing third place. How do you evaluate your team's performance?

We are incredibly proud of the Polish team's performance. To come so close to beating Spain, who ultimately became champions, and then win the bronze medal was a historic achievement. It speaks to how much polo in Poland has progressed over the last decade. The result was no accident. Our strong pre-tournament preparation and the strategic planning of Facundo Cordeu as the team's coach were key to this success. The players gave their all, and their teamwork and discipline showed on the field, proving that Poland belongs among Europe's top polo nations.

Do you believe that this result, finishing on the podium in such a competitive European championship, can inspire more Polish players to take up polo?

Absolutely. Success is a powerful motivator. When young athletes see Polish players competing against the best in Europe and winning a medal, it creates a sense of possibility. We have already seen growing interest from people wanting to try polo, and our hope is that this momentum continues. This podium finish is proof that with dedication and the right infrastructure, Polish polo can compete at the highest level.

Looking ahead, what are the next goals for Sowiniec Polo Club and for the Polish Polo Association after this successful tournament?

For Sowiniec Polo Club, our priority is to continue raising the level of play for our members and solidify our reputation as a leading polo destination. Thanks to years of investment and expertise, our fields are already regarded as the best in this part of Europe, and with our ongoing collaboration with club manager Jakub Antczak and Battro Polo Fields, they are on track to become the very best in all of Europe.

We also successfully tested the Polo Analytics app during the championship with excellent results. This cutting-edge tool focuses on horse performance and assessment, offering unmatched accuracy in tracking speed, distance, and training data. It is quickly becoming an invaluable resource for evaluating horses and optimizing their performance, giving players and trainers a new level of insight and precision.

For the Polish Polo Association, the goal is to build on this momentum by attracting new players, hosting more international events, and continuing to professionalize the sport in Poland. The championship has shown what is possible, and now it is about turning this success into lasting growth for polo in our country.

The II FIP Arena World Polo Championship Heads to Virginia




The II FIP Arena World Polo Championship returns this October for its second edition, and for the first time, the stage will be set in the United States. From October 5 to 12, 2025, six national teams will gather in Crozet and Charlottesville, Virginia, to compete for the international crown of arena polo. The tournament will be co-hosted by Roseland Polo Club and Virginia Polo Inc., two venues that embody the tradition and growth of American polo. Building on the success of the inaugural championship in Buenos Aires in 2023, the Virginia event will bring together seasoned players and rising stars for a week of world-class competition. Alongside host nation United States, the lineup includes France (defending champions), Argentina, Guatemala, Italy, and Pakistan. Each will be looking to etch their name in history as the discipline of arena polo takes another step on the international stage. Roseland Polo Club (Crozet, Virginia) has built a reputation for developing the game in the Charlottesville region, with programs, schools, and clinics that nurture new players and promote competitive polo. The club also organizes tournaments that attract intrastate and inter-circuit play under USPA rules. Virginia Polo Inc. (Charlottesville, Virginia), home to the University of Virginia polo program, offers year-round play with outstanding facilities, including an indoor and outdoor arena and a full-size grass field. A student-run institution, Virginia Polo has been a powerhouse in intercollegiate polo for decades, amassing multiple national titles while instilling values of teamwork,

dedication, and responsibility. As in every FIP championship, horses are at the heart of the event. All mounts will undergo thorough veterinary checks ahead of the tournament to ensure health and soundness. Under the guidance of Horsemaster Charlie Muldoon, horses will be graded A, B, or C by ability and organized into balanced strings. Teams will then draw lots to determine their pool of mounts, guaranteeing fairness while showcasing horsemanship at the highest level. All matches of the II FIP Arena World Polo Championship will be streamed live on the USPA Polo Network, allowing fans across the globe to follow the action, insights, and stories of the players and nations competing for the title. ▶

Ali King and the vision behind Roseland Polo Club

This October, international attention will turn to Virginia as Roseland Polo Club in Crozet, together with Virginia Polo Inc. in Charlottesville, hosts the II FIP Arena World Polo Championship. From October 5–12, teams from across the globe will gather to compete for one of the most significant titles in arena polo, with the final set to be played at Roseland Polo Club against the backdrop of the Blue Ridge Mountains.

The event represents a milestone for the Federation of International Polo, underscoring its mission to expand arena polo worldwide and provide a stage where nations can compete at the highest level. For the United States, long recognized as a leader in arena polo, the championship is both a celebration of its heritage and an opportunity to showcase the sport to a wider audience.

The successful bid reflects years of work by Roseland Polo Club, Virginia Polo Inc., and the U.S. Polo Association, who together bring infrastructure, expertise, and community support to ensure an event of international standards. Weekly polo at Roseland, combined with the history of the University of Virginia polo program, has helped establish the region as a natural home for this world-class competition.

As anticipation builds, the II FIP Arena World Polo Championship promises not only to deliver exciting play on the field but also to reaffirm the role of arena polo within the broader international polo community.

Ali, what does it mean for Roseland Polo Club to host the II FIP Arena World Polo Championship, especially as it's the first time the event will be played in the United States?

Roseland Polo is so very excited and honored to have been chosen as the host site for the II FIP Arena World Polo Championship! It's thrilling to have been selected alongside the VA Polo Center as one of the clubs to represent Polo in the United States. In applying as a host site for this illustrious event, we knew we were competing with giants in the US polo community, and it is a real tribute to the hard work of my team and the exceptional reputation of King Family Vineyards and Roseland polo, as well as our Co-hosts at the Virginia Polo Center.



It's extremely gratifying to have been selected among so many spectacular facilities and programs.

How did Roseland Polo Club prepare to be selected as a host?

Roseland Polo is often in the public eye, as we host matches every Sunday, from Memorial Day through the end of October. We are comfortable with the logistics of hosting large crowds, as folks from Charlottesville, Crozet, and surrounding areas pour in to watch and enjoy the vineyard every week. In taking on an event of this caliber, the biggest consideration was in shifting our typical attendance to the arena, which we feel prepared for and excited about. King Family Vineyards and Roseland Polo are prepared to show off the best of Virginia hospitality and polo.

What qualities do you think Crozet and Charlottesville bring to this event?

Players and spectators alike should enjoy all that Charlottesville has to offer while in town. The area boasts world-renowned historic sites, scenic parks and waterways, endless outdoor activities, a vibrant art and cultural scene, and spectacular shopping destinations. Charlottesville has a particularly diverse food and wine scene, of which King Family Vineyards is honored to be a part. Virginia and the King Family boast strong hospitality roots, which will be showcased all week as players and fans come in from all over the world. Our vineyard will be hosting the welcome event in the

beautiful Carriage House, and I can't think of a place more fitting.

What preparations are being made at Roseland Polo Club to welcome the players?

Primarily, we are working on perfecting arena drainage, irrigation, grading, and dragging to ensure the players and horses are always enjoying top-notch conditions. As part of the same project, supported by the USPA's PDI grant, we are improving our horse path down to the arena from the barn and trailer parking. Roseland will also be housing many of the horses shipping in for the games, and we are preparing for their arrival. We are additionally focused on supporting the USPA as best we can in their preparations.

Virginia is known for its strong arena polo tradition. How do you think hosting this championship will spotlight that heritage?

Virginia's strong roots in arena polo make it a fitting location for this event. Roseland players and spectators have been exposed to more grass polo than anything, and our club is especially excited for our community to get a taste of arena polo at its best, and hope that it spurs a greater interest in, and appreciation for, arena polo and our own beautiful arena moving forward.

How do you see this event inspiring more young players in local programs, colleges, and universities?

My hope would be that experiencing this once-in-a-lifetime event here in our own backyard would inspire younger players and intrigue those who have never been able to experience the sport of polo before. With Virginia Polo Center as Co-hosts, I'd imagine the local college players are very involved during the week of the games and that the experience lights a spark in a great many of them. Roseland would love to see new youth and adult players and fans emerge from the attention the event should see.

What message do you hope the U.S. and Virginia send to the polo community through this championship?

We are looking forward to the greater polo community having the opportunity to see all Roseland has to offer, from spectacular facilities and a tremendously welcoming polo community to the winery, events, and hospitality that King Family Vineyards provides. In a broader sense, we would like to see the sport of Polo in the United States be uplifted by hosting a seamless week of exceptional polo. Polo is often perceived as inaccessible here in the United States, and Roseland has always resisted this idea in our own community and management style. Arena polo in itself is a wonderful path forward to help grow the sport and spread the love of polo in the US.

How do you envision the legacy of this tournament for Roseland Polo Club and for arena polo in the United States?

We are hopeful for our own program and the sport of polo to have spectators coming in from far and wide. The feedback from our local community, as well as surrounding cities such as Richmond and Washington D.C., has been enthusiastic to say the least! We plan to provide a top-notch experience for those who attend, and with polo of this caliber to watch, ideally, it will develop a long-term appreciation and love for the sport of Polo in the next generation of players and fans. We are excited for the world to see the passion and commitment we feel for the horses, players, and the sport of Polo, which is the heartbeat of everything we do here at Roseland.




