
Uniting Nations on the Polo field

ARGENTINA HOSTED INAUGURAL ARENA POLO WORLD CUP

Argentina once again took center stage as it played host to a prestigious polo tournament. Following the successful inaugural Women's World Cup just over a year ago, the nation welcomed the first-ever Arena Polo World Cup, organized in collaboration with the Federation of International Polo (FIP).

From Monday, May 1st, to Saturday, May 6th, this highly anticipated competition unfolded, featuring the participation of six nations: the host country Argentina, the triumphant French team, the United States, Uruguay, Austria, and Morocco.

The captivating matches unfolded at the esteemed La Carona Polo Club in Capilla del Señor, a renowned venue associated with Argentina Polo Day. The joint efforts of the FIP and the Argentine Polo Association (AAP) ensured a seamless organization of this momentous event.

In a riveting final showdown, France emerged as the victors, surpassing the United States in an exhilarating extra-time battle.

Argentina finished in the fifth-place. The Argentine team faced a nail-biting semifinal clash against the United States, with the match concluding in a narrow 10-9 victory for the Americans. As per the tournament format, following the semifinal matches, Argentina and Austria (both semifinal losers) engaged in a penalty shootout to determine which team would compete for third place and which would contend for fifth. The Europeans proved their mettle in this decisive shootout, emerging victorious.

On the final day of competition, Argentina demonstrated their prowess with a commanding 10-2 win over Morocco in the battle for fifth place. In the contest for third place, Uruguay prevailed in a hard-fought encounter against Austria, clinching a narrow 7-6 victory and securing a place on the podium.

The Arena Polo World Cup not only showcased exceptional displays of skill from the participating nations but also >





marked a significant milestone in the global recognition and development of arena polo as a distinct discipline. With France crowned as the inaugural champions of this prestigious event, the excitement and anticipation surrounding future editions of the Arena World Cup continue to build, as the sport reaches new heights of popularity and competition. ■

FRANCE, THE GRAND CHAMPIONS OF ARENA POLO

Winds of change are sweeping through the global polo scene, bringing with them a new competition and a newly crowned world champion. France emerged victorious in the inaugural FIP Arena Polo World Cup held in Argentina, marking the first time the French team has claimed a global polo championship in any discipline.

In a thrilling and closely contested final, France prevailed over the United States with a narrow 9-8 victory. The tournament, jointly organized by the Federation of International Polo (FIP) and the Argentine Polo Association (AAP), took place at La Carona Polo Club in Capilla del Señor.

The final showcased the extraordinary balance between the two teams, as the outcome was ultimately decided in an extra chukker with a goal scored by Gaetan Gosset. With this winning goal, France managed to take the lead on the scoreboard for the first time in the match, excluding the initial handicap advantage they held.

In the semifinals, France staged a remarkable comeback, dominating the last chukker with a resounding 6-0 win, overturning the match and defeating Austria 11-7 to secure their place in the tournament's grand final. Meanwhile, the United States claimed a hard-fought 10-9 victory over the host nation, Argentina. ▶

The inaugural Arena Polo World Cup exceeded all expectations, leaving a lasting impression on the sport. Similar to the recent absolute World Cup where Spain triumphed in Palm Beach for the first time, another nation can now proudly claim the title of polo monarch.

Germany secures vic European Champions

In a moment of pure sporting brilliance, Germany has clinched the title of European women's polo champions for the second time in its history. Their remarkable 6-2 win over Italy's Azzurre team in Punta Ala has crowned them as the champions of the Ladies FIP European Polo Championship - U.S. Polo Assn. Trophy, a title they previously won in 2018. With this triumph, Germany also secured their place in the II FIP Women's World Polo Championship 2024.

For Italy, there may be disappointment in their defeat after securing victories against England and France earlier in the tournament. Nevertheless, they can still take pride in their position at the top of European polo, as evidenced by the resounding standing ovation the team and staff received from the appreciative crowd at the Equestrian Centre, with over 3,000 spectators attending the three days of competition. ▶ The organizational success of the event, hosted by the Italian Equestrian Sports Federation and played at the club wonderfully restored by Gaia Bulgari, remains unquestionable. Gaia Bulgari's efforts have brought back the splendor of the past to this prestigious club. "Sport brings victories as well as defeats," stated Marco Di Paola, the president of the Italian Equestrian Sports Federation. "Today, we had hoped for a victory, but Germany proved to be superior, and we accept the outcome. However, it is important to highlight that today, above all, sport emerged as the true winner. These past four days have been filled with excitement."

The awards ceremony for the fourth edition of the Ladies FIP European Polo Championship - U.S. Polo Assn. Trophy was graced by the presence of Elena Nappi, the mayor of Castiglione della Pescaia. She reminisced about the glory days of Italian championships and acknowledged the incredible revitalization brought by Gaia Bulgari to Punta Ala, making it a hub for polo, golf, and the harbor. The Polizia di Stato's Fanfara led the medals ceremony, further adding to the grandeur of the occasion. >











Polo Club Saint-Tropez won the 2023 POLO RIDER CUP

Between June 14 and 24th the 3rd edition of the POLO RIDER CUP took place in a new venue, Polo Club Saint Tropez. During 10 days 12 teams competed for the Rider Cup Trophies, RIDER CUP, CHALLENGE CUP AND SHAUGAN CUP.

The magnificent facilities of the Saint Tropez Polo Cup witnessed 10 days of excellent polo and great after polo events hosted by Game Polo and Sponsors.

FIP is once more proud of endorsing this International Polo event and is looking forward for the 2024 edition.

POLO CLUB SAINT-TROPEZ emerged as the winner of the 2023 POLO RIDER CUP, defeating Amadeus Polo Club by a score of 13 ½ - 9 in the final held at the Polo Club Saint-Tropez in Haras de Gassin, France.

The victorious Polo Club Saint-Tropez had Santiago Chavanne playing alongside his sons, Pedro and Lorenzo. Dutch player Nicky Sen, a long-time partner of the Chavanne family, completed the team. On the other hand, Amadeus Polo Club was led by Austrian player Robert Kofler, who was joined by Bartolomé Bayugar, Hilario Ruiz Guiñazú, and Santiago Marambio.

Amadeus Polo Club made a strong start, winning the first chukker with a score of 3-1 ½ goals. However, Polo Club Saint-Tropez gradually closed the gap, and from the second chukker onwards, the host team took control of the game.

During the fourth chukker, the Italian team attempted to narrow the lead, but as soon as Polo Club Saint-Tropez went on the offensive, they extended their advantage by five goals. ▶



The final score of the match was 13 ½ - 9 goals in favor of the French team, thereby securing them the 2023 POLO RIDER CUP.

Lorenzo Chavanne was awarded the title of MVP for the tournament, and his pony named 'Channel' received the recognition of Best Playing Pony of the match. Martin Aguerre H and Salvador Jauretche were acknowledged as the Best Scorers, while Pedro Chavanne was recognized as the Rookie of the tournament.



New rules for the 2023 Polo Rider Cup

The Polo Rider Cup introduced some thrilling rule modifications. While the HPA rules were utilized, there are several exceptions and special rules specifically designed for the 2023 Polo Rider Cup.

These rule modifications were made to produce an even more exhilarating and dynamic Polo Rider Cup, pushing the boundaries of the sport and ensuring a captivating experience for players and spectators alike.

Change of sides.

Rule 6.4 Changing Ends of FIP's International Rules for Polo are modified for the Polo Rider Cup.

Therefore, the rule should be read as follows:

Changing ends:

Ends shall be changed after every chukker. After a goal is scored the team that was scored at will have a knock in from the 60 yard line. The ball will be placed by the umpire after 15 seconds that the goal was scored and there will be five seconds for the hitter to hit at the ball.

Duration of the games and chuckers.

Based on the discussions and suggestions made by the teams after last year's Polo Rider Cup with regards

to the number of chukkers and the time for all players to change horses the following rule will be applied for Polo Rider Cup 2023:

Games will be played at 5 chukkers and each chukker will be divided in two half chukkers of 3 minutes and 30 seconds plus 15 seconds after the first bell. There will be 1 minute to change horses between the half chukkers.

Penalty 4 (60 Yard Penalty) and Penalty 6 New Rule

PENALTY 4 - 60 YARD HIT. One free hit by the team fouled from the centre of the 60 yard line nearest the goal of the team that has fouled. A. The team taking the hit to be positioned behind the ball. The free hit shall be taken in one stroke with the intent to score. If the player taking the hit mishits, misdirects or misses the ball, he or any member of his team may only hit or hit at the ball with a half shot, that is with the head of the stick starting the downward swing below the shoulder of the hitter, until the ball has been hit or hit at by a player of the team facing the hit. However, the stick may be raised above the shoulder to stop or re-direct the ball. B. All of the team defending the hit to be positioned on or behind the back line, with only two between the posts.

New Rule Penalty 6 (Ball hit behind by Defender)

The ball shall be placed on the 60 yard line opposite where it went out of play over the back line but no more than 40
